## Location and Conference Venue

Syros is the capital of the Cyclades cluster of islands. The architecture of the capital city of Ermoupolis is distinguished for the elegant Venetian mansions, the picturesque quarter of 'Vaporia' neighbourhood, the large Orthodox and Catholic churches and the impressive neoclassical public buildings among which The Municipal Cultural Centre that will host the conference activities. The natural landscape of Syros is unique and peaceful - consisting of small rocky hills, narrow bays and beaches. The conference workshop will take place along one-day sea cruise to the islands of Delos and Mykonos. Delos is the sacred island in Classical Antiquity with extremely important and well-preserved archaeological sites. Mykonos is the most cosmopolitan of the Greek islands; its capital town (Chora) is a spectacularly picturesque Cycladic settlement with tiny streets and whitewashed steps, houses and churches.

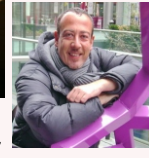

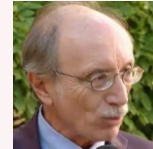

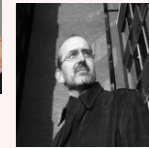
